The Future of the Ames Aquifer Through the Eyes of Computer Modeling

The above gives details of the highlight of our year, the Annual Initiation Banquet. All events will take place in the same rooms of the Scheman Building. See later in this Newsletter for details on Banquet costs and reservation procedures.

The Future of the Ames Aquifer Through the Eyes of Computer Modeling

The Ames aquifer, a combined alluvial and buried valley aquifer, provides drinking water for the residents of Ames and Iowa State University, and treated water industry, golf courses, lawn watering, and a rural water district. In 2008, nearly 2.2 billion gallons of water were pumped from the aquifer. Although the city has continually expanded its well fields and water treatment facilities through the years to meet the demands of a growing population, water demands exceeding 10 million gallons per day have occurred during recent summer months. Because the current treatment plant can only provide 12 million gallons per day, the city has been examining water use, water treatment capacity, and the ability of the aquifer to meet future needs. A reinvestigation of the hydrogeology of Ames aquifer was initiated in 2005. The results of that study suggest that the Ames aquifer can provide as much water as we need in the future under the present climate. However, this optimism is tempered by a number of factors. Future drought may strain our ability to supply water up to the projected 22 million gallons per day by 2063, particularly if additional industry and municipalities become interested in tapping certain parts of the aquifer. Reducing conditions in the aquifer mandate that well maintenance and rehabilitation will be needed to maintain production levels. In addition, the fast recycle time of water in the aquifer suggests that contaminants, particularly those entering the aquifer from the Skunk River and Squaw Creek due to pumping, may eventually pose a threat to water quality. The 3-D groundwater model provides a state-of-the-art view of how the aquifer works and a mechanism to protect this valuable water resource into the future.

Committee Members for 2009-10, as elected via the ballot on page 3 of this Newsletter, will be introduced at the Banquet. William Simpkins will step down as President and Steven Kawaler will assume the office of President. Steve Martin has agreed to become President Elect (and, thus, will also serve as Program Chairman) for 2009-10. William Simpkins and Ruth MacDonald will be retiring from the Executive Committee. Thus, in this election we will elect two new members to the Executive Committee as the ballot indicates. In addition, we will be electing two members to the Membership Committee to replace retiring members Chris Minion and Allen Trenkle; and a new threemember Nominating Committee is elected each year. The ballot strives to retain a balance among disciplines on the various committees.

Banquet Details: Initiates are guests of the Chapter; for all others, cost is \$30.00 per person. The dinner entrée is a turkey or chicken dish, with a vegetarian entrée as an alternative, if requested with the reservation. Page 5 of this Newsletter has a reservation form, with a deadline for receipt of reservations of Monday noon, April 27 (please return reservations sooner, if at all possible). Golden Anniversary Members: Each year we recognize and invite as our guests to the Banquet, those who have been active members of Sigma Xi for 50 years. This year, we have three Golden Anniversary Members, Marshall Luban, Thomas Weber and David Wilder. However, we will also be

pleased to welcome other previously recognized Golden Anniversary Members to the Banquet.

Annual Meeting: The 2008 Sigma Xi Annual Meeting was held in Washington, DC on November 20-23, 2008. It included a well attended and highly successful Student Research Conference, at which delegates served as judges. One of the main themes of the Meeting was Water Quality. The ISU Chapter was represented at the Meeting by our President, William Simpkins.

Dues Structure: National and local dues for the coming year were noted in the January 2009 Newsletter, but the information bears repeating. Each year the dues structure of the Society is evaluated based on a formula tied to the Higher Education Price Index (HEPI), which is comparable to but not the same as the Consumer Price Index (CPI). Based on this formula, delegates at the 2008 Annual Meeting approved the following dues structure for 2009-10: Dues for new (and continuing) Full and Associate Members (non full-time students) are \$95.00; full-time student dues are \$25.00; initiation fee is \$15.00; promotion fee is \$25.00. Due to increasing local costs, the Executive Committee of the ISU Chapter has set the local dues, effective with the 2009-10 fiscal year at \$11.00. As is customary, local dues are waived for initiates and those being promoted. And, of course, each initiate/promotee is invited as a guest of the Chapter at the Initiation Banquet.
